

# Holy Eucharist & Healing Prayer

*Officiant* Blessed be God: most holy, glorious, and undivided Trinity.

*People* And blessed be God's reign, now and forever. Amen.

*The Presider and People then say*

Lord, have mercy.

**Christ, have mercy.**

Lord, have mercy.

*The Presider then says the Collect of the Day*

*The Gospel is proclaimed. A time of reflection follows.*

*The Presider then begins the Prayers saying*

Our Lord Jesus healed many as a sign of the reign of God come near and sent the disciples to continue this work of healing. We too are called to this ministry of prayer and now, in the name of Christ, the great healer and reconciler of the world, we entrust to God all who are in need of healing.

Let us pray.

*One* Loving God, our source and our final home, we give you thanks for the gifts of life on earth, for our human bodies and all you have created. Help us always to be mindful of our blessings, even in times of stress and discomfort, that we may use them in ways that please you and serve others.

*All* In your great mercy,  
**hear our prayer.**

*One* Merciful God, by the wounds of your Son we are healed. Bring your saving health to all people and to communities throughout the world, that divisions may cease and brothers and sisters may live together in peace.

*All* In your great mercy,  
**hear our prayer.**

*One* Holy God, your Spirit came upon us in the waters of baptism and brought us into the communion of saints. Renew in us the grace of baptism, by which we share in Christ's death and resurrection.

*All* In your great mercy,  
**hear our prayer.**

*One* Restoring God, your Son Jesus brought healing and wholeness to all. Bring your healing presence now to all who are in any distress, especially those we name now before you, aloud or in silence.

*All* In your great mercy,  
**hear our prayer.**

*One* Almighty God, source of human knowledge, give skill, wisdom, and compassion to all who provide medical care, and keep them safe.

*All* In your great mercy,  
**hear our prayer.**

*One* Loving God, our creator and redeemer, give gentleness and courage to family members, friends, and caregivers of all who are suffering.  
In your great mercy,  
*All* **hear our prayer.**

*Presider* God of great and abundant mercy, with your presence sustain all for whom we pray. Drive away their suffering, give them firm hope, and strengthen their trust in you; through Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord.  
*All* **Amen.**

*The Presider prays for each person present, saying*

*N.*, I lay my hands upon you and anoint you in the name of our Savior Jesus Christ, praying you will be strengthened and filled with God's grace, that you may know the healing power of the Spirit. Amen.

*The Presider and People then pray together*

**Living God, grant comfort in suffering to all. When we are afraid, give courage; when afflicted, give patience; when dejected, give hope; and when alone, assure us of the support of your holy people. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.**

*Presider* The Peace of Christ be always with you.  
*People* **And also with you.**

*The Prayer of the Eucharist follows, after which the Presider and People pray saying*

*All* **Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy Name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.**

*We invite all those worshipping at home now to say this prayer:*

In union, O Lord, with your faithful people at every altar of your Church, I desire to offer to you praise and thanksgiving. Since I cannot receive you today in the Sacrament of your Body and Blood, I beseech you to come spiritually into my heart. Cleanse and strengthen me with your grace, Lord Jesus, and let me never be separated from you. May I live in you, and you in me, in this life and in the life to come. Amen.

*The Prayer Book for the Armed Forces, alt.*

*After the bread and wine are shared, the Presider says*

Let us pray.

*All* **God of abundance, you have fed us with the bread of life and cup of salvation; you have united us with Christ and one another; and you have made us one with all your people in heaven and on earth. Now send us forth in the power of your Spirit, that we may proclaim your redeeming love to the world and continue for ever in the risen life of Christ our Savior. Amen.**
